Nonfilers

An AGI figure won't be available for someone who isn't required to file a tax return. A nonfiler would instead report on the FAFSA income earned from work, which includes any income reported on the individual's forms W-2 plus any other earnings from work not reported on those forms. (Even if no taxes were paid on this income earned from work, it should not be reported as untaxed income on the FAFSA.) A properly completed verification worksheet sufficiently documents income earned from work. No further documentation is required. If the student doesn't complete a verification worksheet, the school must require from each nonfiler a signed statement certifying his or her nonfiler status and listing the sources and amounts of income. The school can also accept copies of the W-2 forms.
