

**Campus Life Taskforce  
Minutes – 02/05/08 2:15 p.m.**

The Campus Life Taskforce met on Tuesday, February 5th at 2:15 p.m. in the P.E. Department of the Student Center Building. Those present were Cindy Martin, Lisa Bridges, Brett Watson, Carol Lattimore, Kimberly Snyder, Tina Porter, Terry McEntire, Tiffany Cooper, and John Kiser.

The committee discussed and decided to order 100 informational pamphlets titled "STD's, What You Need to Know" for 99 cents each for campus distribution. Terry McEntire will place the order in Cindy Martin's name.

Kimberly announced that there will be a demonstration on self defense provided by the Sheriff's department available to everyone on February 27<sup>th</sup> at 10:00 and 2:00 in the gym. She encouraged faculty members to promote this event to their students and/or provide extra credit to increase attendance. She also went over SGA suggestions for Sports Day activities for committee input.

The committee discussed and decided to order items for Sports Day promotion from Oriental Trading Company. These items will be used to promote this year's focus on the country of China and the Olympic games and will include; a dragon made of crepe paper for table decoration (\$4), 200 fortune cookies for student distribution (\$28), medals for contest winners (4 sets of first, second and third place), and spinning tops (\$4) to use for competitions between students as they wait in line for food at the informational table.

The committee decided to provide items for several activities/contests for Sports Day making sure to provide the history and proper Chinese name for the activity. Cindy Martin will bring stilts. The committee will search for people who are willing to loan ping pong tables for student contests. Cindy will see if there are funds available to purchase a table out of Physical Education or Campus Life funds. The above referenced spinning tops will also be used in a contest. Kimberly will request an obstacle course and mechanical swings from the amusement vendor to go along with the "China" theme.

A prize basket will be located on the informational table (put together by Brett) with items relating to China. A Chinese flag will be made by a member(s) of the committee for display. Cindy will ask Johnathan Jones if he might find a recording of the Chinese national anthem to play during the awarding of medals. Kimberly will ask SGA members to make posters to promote the emphasis on China theme. Flyers will be made listing the available activities and when they are scheduled.

Tina Porter asked for input regarding a student newspaper. Suggested possible contacts for more information regarding interest in publishing one were: Dr. Johnson and/or Management Team, Kathy Ackerman for faculty sponsorship and the TALC Steering Committee.

Tiffany Cooper reported that contact has been made with Rutherford Hospital concerning a possible "healthcare/health occupations fair" planned for next fall. The committee suggested two possible dates (Thursday, September 18 or 25). Tiffany will contact members of the management team to see if there are any conflicts with these dates as well as the hospital. She distributed a handout to members and asked for input for the event.
