Hurricane relief donations, collected by the SGA and Scott Brady, were successfully gathered and transported during the months of October and November.

Exercise in the form of line dancing will be offered on Tuesdays and Thursdays at noon for the remainder of fall semester to support the NC Way to Health efforts. These exercise sessions may be continued in spring semester depending on campus interest and participation.

The budget was discussed. Committee members were asked to think of ways to spend the remaining \$500 and bring ideas back to the committee.

The committee discussed ways to promote globalization on campus. Planning for an "International Festival" was discussed. Brainstorming for possible campus locations, dates, and times was the primary focus of the meeting. Cindy Martin will ask if the SGA would like to collaborate on this effort during Sports Day in spring 2005. She will also talk with Nancy Womack to see if the Cultural Events Committee would like to join in the effort. The Diverse Cultural and Historical Perspectives Committee formed during planning of the QEP (chaired by Brett Parker) was also suggested as a possible resource.

The next meeting will be held during the 2nd or 3rd week in January with the primary focus being the planning of the International Festival. The meeting adjourned at 12:30 p.m.
